Eligible Applicants		Individual artists are eligible for Folk Arts Apprenticeship Project Grants that support the perpetuation of traditional skills. Limited matching funds are available for ethnic communities through the Ethnic Arts Project Grants. We also provide technical assistance, referrals and resources for any activities involving traditional or folk arts and artists.	
Restrictions on Use of Assistance		All folk arts program funds and assistance are restricted for the benefit of community-based, traditional artists and art forms. They do not support contemporary studio crafts or the reproduction of antiques, re-creations of historical art forms, or highly choreographed or orchestrated interpretations of folk or ethnic arts.
