<b>Purpose of the Program</b>		Training and technical assistance programs concerning drug abuse education and prevention through (1) development and dissemination of curriculum materials; (2) demonstration projects in drug abuse education and prevention; (3) special financial assistance to enhance resources available for drug abuse education and prevention in areas serving large numbers of economically disadvantaged children or sparsely populated areas, or to meet special needs; and (4) administrative costs of the state educational agency, not in excess of four percent of the amounts available.	
<b>Eligible Applicants</b>		Local school districts are eligible, consistent with the State Office of Education's annual substance abuse prevention plan, to apply for discretionary/supplementary Safe and Drug-Free Schools funds for those specific activities listed above as (2) demonstration projects and (3) special financial assistance.	
<b>Restrictions on Use of Assistance</b>		Covers only direct costs required to administer and provide instructional services to supplement the district's regular instructional program.	
<b>Application Procedures</b>		School districts may apply for discretionary/supplementary Safe and Drug-Free Schools funds by submitting standard application form which meets the criteria set forth in the Safe and Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act and which provides a description of the need for the funding and the means by which such funding will enhance and expand the district's existing substance abuse prevention program.

<b>Range and Average of Financial Assistance</b>			
<b>Source of Funds and Aid</b>		The State Office of Education typically makes a portion of the discretionary funds available to districts whose formula/ entitlement allocation is less than \$5,000. In addition, districts who wish to fund special model demonstration projects or who demonstrate great need for additional funds may be eligible to apply for discretionary funds.
