

**Migrant Education Program, Title I**

<b>Purpose of the Program</b>		The Migrant Education Program provides summer educational programs that include small-class and tutorial instruction in the basic skills for eligible children, ages 3-21 whose parents, spouse, or the student himself/herself temporarily reside in the State of Utah. Special programs in the basic skills and in career awareness are provided for students at the appropriate grade levels.	
<b>Eligible Applicants</b>		To be eligible for the program, a student must be the child of a migratory agricultural worker or fisherman, or a related occupation. Students remain eligible for three years after their families cease to migrate. Any public school district enrolling at least ten eligible migrant students may apply for a sub grant. Other school districts with fewer than ten eligible students, but with unique needs, may also apply.	
<b>Restrictions on Use of Assistance</b>		Within limits established by Federal and State regulations, migrant education funds may be used to pay costs for instruction and support services directly attributable to a program, except where other funds are available for the same or similar purpose. No matching funds are required.	
<b>Application Procedures</b>		Each spring, the State Office of Education provides necessary forms, instructions, and guidelines for applying, and provides technical assistance to districts wishing to apply.

<b>Application Deadline</b>		45 days before the beginning date of the program.	
<b>Range and Average of Financial Assistance</b>		Approximately \$1,400,000 statewide	
<b>Source of Funds and Aid</b>		The State Office of Education receives a grant on behalf of the State during the previous year. Sub grants are made to school districts and other eligible agencies. The sub grants are discretionary. The amount is determined by the number of children to be served and the scope of the services to be provided and consideration of local resources.
