Purpose of the Program	Through the JJDP Act, Utah receives federal formula (block) grant funds based on the number of youth under 18 years of age in the state, to support and develop projects and activities for the prevention of juvenile delinquency; for the de-institutionalization, diversion, care and treatment of juvenile offenders; and for the improvement of the juvenile justice system.	
Eligible Applicants	State and local government agencies and private not-for-profit agencies dealing with the juvenile justice system and related issues.	
Restrictions on Use of Assistance	Funds are to be used to address juvenile justice system/delinquency prevention concerns, practices, policies and programs.	
Application Procedures	Requests for Concept Papers (RCP's)/Request for Proposals (RFP's) will be sent out by CCJJ to juvenile justice system/delinquency prevention agencies soliciting proposals each spring for projects beginning July 1.. Agencies/individuals may also request that they be placed on a RFP mailing list.	
State Clearinghouse Coordination	Per E.O. 12372	
Application Deadline	Due date for proposals or concept papers will be 30-45 days after announcement.	
Range and Average of Financial Assistance	Subgrant awards will vary and may range from \$2,000 to \$75,000 depending on the scope and purpose of the project.	
Source of Funds and Aid	The Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Act of 1974, as amended.	
Matching Formula	Federal	No state or local funds are required to match federal funds. However, for projects funded for more than one year, continuation funding is decreased for second and third year
