Eligible Applicants		Any not-for-profit organization, governmental entity, neighborhood organization, or individual residing in the State of Utah.	
Restrictions on Use of Assistance		Funds must be used to address one or more areas: a) gang identification, intervention and suppression; b) community mobilization; c) exploring alternative approaches to dealing with gangs.	
Application Procedures		Applications can be obtained from the Commission on Criminal and Juvenile Justice in March of each year.
